Government of India is going to pass many a bills connected with higher education system in the ensuing winter sessions of the Parliament. All the Bills are intended to further commercialize higher education and siphon public funds to the private operators in the name of highly publicized Public Private Partnership (PPP). They are intended to bypass the legislature, judiciary, normal executive structures and put all powers in few central bodies appointed, essentially, by central government. They are intended to establish a new trade friendly regime in place of the decades old institutions like UGC, NCTE, AICTE, MCI etc. Yes, the present day regulatory bodies are not good, but all those bodies which the government want to establish anew viz 'The National Council', 'The Tribunals', 'The Accreditation Authority' and the regime of World Trade Organization are going to be worst possible systems.
